In Kings Park itself, the KPCA sponsors Parliament Pool, Kings Park and Kings Glen Elementary Schools, neighborhood cub and girl scouts, and more. It's not just the board itself though, the whole neighborhood enjoys a wonderful community spirit and neighborhood camaraderie. Whenever someone posts on Facebook or NextDoor, residents always respond with advice or help. It's a wonderful place to live.



As the weather continues to warm up, I look forward to seeing more neighbors out and about, whether at KPCA events, at the pool, or just walking/running/biking around the area. Since the start of the KPCA fiscal year our income is **\$10,312**. This increase since the January report is made up of membership dues (\$6,292), donations (\$2,095) and advertising revenue (\$400).

Our expenses for this time period are \$7,761. The increase since January includes Gazette printing (\$664), lawn care (\$1,040), holiday party (\$373) and administrative expenses (\$458).

Thoughts on Fire Safety By Susan Cappa, VP of Community Safety

Our Houses are beautiful and well-built, but they are old. Mine was built in 1963. Therefore, our houses don't have many safety features or the electrical capacity that are standard in newer homes. Tripping your circuit breakers is a clue that you may need more electrical capacity. If you haven't already, call a licensed electrician for an inspection of your home's electrical system. You may need to replace worn out wiring, add outlets or circuits, increase the amount of electricity that comes into your home, or replace the main electrical panel. Failure to take care of your electrical system can lead to a costly, or deadly, fire.

In addition to getting your home's electrical system in shape, there are other safety measures that you can take to ensure that your home is safe from accidental fires.

- Smoke alarms. Install at least one smoke alarm on each floor. If the alarms are battery-operated, change batteries annually. If you have a smoker in your house, install a smoke alarm in their bedroom.
- Get the whole family involved in fire safety. Teach your young children about smoke alarms, review what they need to do when a smoke alarm goes off. Develop an evacuation plan in case of fire and review it with the whole family. Discuss what to do if they find hazardous materials, such as matches, smoldering cigarettes, fireworks, or fire starters.
- Cook Carefully. Clean your stovetop before and after cooking, to lessen the possibility of grease fires. If you have a grease fire, put a lid on it and take the pot off the flame. Cook with pot handles inward, to keep pots on the stove. Don't wear flowing garments when cooking. Keep the cooking area child-free to ensure

their (and your) safety. Don't leave cooking pots unattended. If you have an induction cooktop, there are special safety requirements. Read up on the safety features and follow them.

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- Protect Major Appliances; Add surge protectors to your computer systems and HVAC systems to protect them from electrical surges and lessen the risk of fire.
- Fireplace safety. If you have a fireplace and use it, have the chimney cleaned regularly. Use firescreens to keep cinders in the fireplace and clean the hearth regularly.
- Give Space Heaters Space. Only plug space heaters into wall outlets, do not plug them into extension cords. Keep heaters 3 feet away from drapes, cushions, or other flammable materials. Don't go to sleep, or leave your house, with a space heater on.
- Lithium Battery Safety. If you have a cell phone, a laptop, an electric car or scooter; then you've got a lithium battery. Since lithium batteries store a lot of energy in a small space, if defective or improperly stored, they can catch fire or explode. Store and charge them away from your bed, at room temperature, away from flammable items. If batteries are warm, leaking, or making noises; discontinue use and call 911.






"LITT'L BIT O' BRIT" TOUR By Sandy Kester, Kings' Park resident since 1999

'allo, chaps. 'ow are ya? Doin' alright, 'opefully. We're back on the tour in our neighborhood discovering the origins of the names of our streets here in Kings' Park. Today our tour will be on one of our longest streets: Southampton Drive. Let's get right on the bus and go right to Southampton, England, a seaside town that is 69 miles south of London. What's so special about Southampton, you ask. Let's uncover ten notables of its history:

#1 – The birthplace of the ship the Titanic. It was built and departed here on April 10th, 1912, only to be sunk on April 15th, 5 days later. 1,514 lives perished aboard with only 706 survivors.



#2 – Author Jane Austen lived here for 2 years, had her 18th birthday here and wrote *Sense and Sensibility* while living here.

#3 – The Normans arrived here first in 1066. This is also comedian Benny Hill's birthplace in 1924.

#4 – Southampton University is listed in the Top 100 Universities in the world.

#5 – Approximately 450 cruise ships dock here yearly.

#6 – Clarence Birdseye, American inventor/entrepreneur, tested and marketed his original frozen Fish Fingers (we call them fish sticks) here in 1953.



#7 – The Mayflower ship set sail for America from here in 1620 with our pilgrim forefathers aboard.




#8 – Southampton applied for city status in 1929 but King George V rejected it. Finally, it became a legitimate city in 1964.

#9 – In 1180 A.D., a wall was built around this medieval town and became its entrance. A portion of the wall is called the Bargate and still stands in the center of town on High Street.

#10 – It is considered the sunniest and warmest city in the UK. It once reached 96 degrees in 1976.
